SJP STUDENTS TAKE ON ROTARY CLUB'S TECHNOLOGY TOURNAMENT CHALLENGE

Each year the Rotary Club of Great Britain holds a technology tournament for schools. Groups of four students from different key stages go against each other to design a device to solve a problem. This year's problem was to transport an aid package across a crocodile infested river. The students had to design a way of getting the package across the river on a wire and drop it below. SJP sent two Year 10 teams and a Year 12 team to take on other local schools. This was a difficult task and the students had time to think about the problem and decide on their approach. Marks were awarded for planning, teamwork, communication and problem solving as well as the final solution and how it works. In essence, it is the equivalent of a product design project condensed into one day. The students had to work on their own with no input from school staff but there were some engineering apprentices from Airbus UK on hand to answer questions.




PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT: HATE CRIME AWARENESS WEEK

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




YEAR 12 TO PARTICIPATE IN DYNAMIC DRAWING WORKSHOP WITH ENGLISH NATIONAL BALLET
